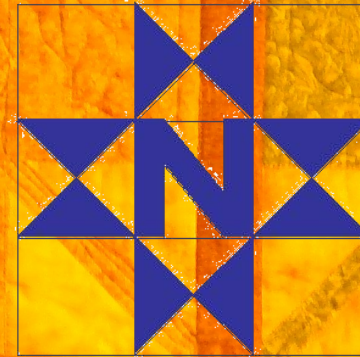

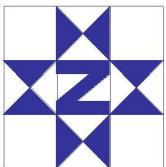

Quilt Appraisal Registration Information

The quilt appraisal registration process occurs via mail. No registrations post-marked prior to April 1, 2013, will be accepted.

Registrations will be processed in the order received.

Registration is for the appraisal of one quilt. After May 1, NSQG members may register a second quilt if space is available. Registration will open on June 1 to non-North Star Quilters Guild members and to NSQG members for additional quilts if space is available.

Confirmation of appraisal registration will be sent via mail. The assigned time slot will be 30 minutes.

Registrants will receive a form for quilt information with their confirmation. This form **MUST** be completed and brought at the time of appraisal. (This is Cindy Brick’s form and Cindy’s rule.) Failure to bring the quilt appraisal form will result in cancellation of the appraisal with no refund.

Quilts entered in the 2013 Quilting on the Red Show will not be appraised.

Appraisals will be conducted in a curtained off area for privacy.

Show Chairs Paint Chip Challenge

Participants must make a quilted item based upon their initials AND actual paint chip colors. Paint chips are the little samples of color that you get at a paint store or at the paint department of stores such as Menards, Lowes, or Walmart.

One of the colors chosen must have "red" in the name. After all, this is "Quilting on the Red."

Regarding your initials: If you are a person who normally uses two initials, then it's your choice to stick to the two, or you have the option to add another, but it must be based on a maiden or middle name. Three initials is the limit. For example, if your name is Brenda Rice, then you can use a paint chip color based on B and R or you can add your maiden name, say Johnson, or middle name, say Marie, and pick your paint chips from BJR or BMR.

Paint Chip Rules: You CANNOT choose chips with a plain color name. For example, you cannot choose blue, pink, and red. Choose chip names like the following examples: pretty in pink or rockin' red. Names such as pear, sand, or seashore are also acceptable for the non-red chip.

Most paint chip colors are a solid color. The fabrics that you choose should read as a solid color or tone on tone print to match your paint chip choices as much as possible. The two or three color chips represent all of the colors that will be present in the finished item. No other colors can be added to the project. However, tints, tones, and shades of the paint chip colors may be used.

Add white to a color to create a tint

Add gray to a color to create a tone

Add black to a color to make a shade. Consult a book on color if needed.

Size of the challenge project is a maximum perimeter of 150 inches. Items may be a quilt, household item, garment, or an accessory. It must have three layers and be quilted.

An entry blank for the Quilting on the Red Quilt Show must be received by Saturday, October 5, 2013, to be eligible in the quilt show. First, second, and third awards will not be made in this category. Awards will be made to "Best Traditional," "Best Contemporary," "Best Use of Color," and "Most Innovative" by the show chairs.

Paint chips must be submitted with the quilt for display with the display tag.

Meet Our Presenters



Mary Fons - Chicago, Illinois

Mary Fons co-hosts the nationally-airing PBS program "Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting" along with her mom, famed quilter and educator Marianne Fons. In 2010, Mary created Quilty, an online show offered weekly on QNNtv.com. Targeted primarily to the beginner quilter, Quilty offers instruction, guidance, and inspiration to those who want to learn to make a quilt, whatever age or experience level. In 2012, Mary created Quilty magazine (New Track Media), which quickly met with critical and commercial acclaim. Quilty is now bi-monthly, available nationwide and via mail. Mary holds a B.A. in Theater Arts from the University of Iowa. Working for years as a full-time freelance writer before being bit by the quilting bug, Mary's work has been published widely in print and online since 2005. Cindy Brick - Castle Rock, Colorado

Cindy Brick is an editor, designer and writer who travels the world teaching about quilting and quilt history. A former editor for *Quilter's Newsletter*, she is also an AQS-certified textiles appraiser and professional quilt restorer. She has written many articles and six books, including **Hanky Panky**, the **Stitcher's Language of Flowers**, **Quilts of the Great Depression**, and the **Fabric Dating Kit**. The first edition of her fifth book, **Crazy Quilts** (Voyageur Press), sold out within two months. **Quilts from the Golden West** (Kansas City Star) is Cindy's sixth book. A sequel to Cindy's *Hanky Panky Crazy Quilts* (twelve printings), *Hanky Panky With A Flourish* is soon to appear; a history of scrap quilting is also on the horizon. (You can see inside Cindy's books both on Amazon, as well as the Brickworks website.)

Nearly all of *Encyclopaedia Britannica's* quilt-related entries are her writing; she also consulted for three television specials on quilting (appeared in person on one), and was on *Simply Quilts* to explain her Hanky Panky quilt method. She has been on an episode of *The Quilt Show* to talk about Crazy quilts.

Cindy is a frequent contributor to various magazines, and continues to write and design for her company, Brickworks. She also frequently writes for several frugal living and personal finance blogs, including her own: **A Brick Looks At Life**. Quilt Entry

1. One entry form and the entry fee must be submitted for each item entered. Entry fee per item is \$5.00 for NSQG members and \$10.00 for nonmembers. Entry forms must be postmarked by October 5, 2013. Mail the entry forms to:

Quilt Delivery

2. Quilts must be delivered to the Alerus Center, 1200 - 42nd Street South, Grand Forks, ND, on Wednesday, October 16, between 12:00-6:00 pm. **YOU WILL BE GIVEN A CLAIM TICKET THAT MUST BE PRESENTED WHEN YOU PICK UP YOUR QUILT.**
3. If you need to ship your quilt, it should be received by October 10 with return shipping in the amount of \$15 and your shipping label enclosed with your entry fee. Shipped quilts should be sent to:

4. The North Star Quilters Guild reserves the right to refuse quilts that are not clean, smell of smoke, covered with pet hair, or are otherwise not suitable for display. If your quilt is not accepted due to these reasons, your entry fee will be refunded. Please look your quilt over carefully prior to quilt take in.
5. Entries may be limited depending on available space. Entries exhibited for judging in previous North Star Quilters Guild quilt shows will not be accepted.
6. The North Star Quilters Guild reserves the right to place quilts in a more appropriate category or to consolidate categories if there are insufficient entries in a single category.

Disclaimer of Responsibility:

Reasonable care will be taken by the North Star Quilters Guild to assure the safe care of all entries during exhibition. Entrants are responsible for their own insurance. I hereby agree that neither the North Star Quilters Guild, any of its members, nor The Alerus Center shall be responsible for any loss, theft, or damage to any article exhibited by me.

Security

7. The North Star Quilters Guild and The Alerus Center will not be responsible for any damage, loss, or theft. Check your homeowner's or renter's insurance for coverage. Awards

8. First, second, and third place ribbons will be awarded in each category except category 15. The challenge category will have four ribbons: Best Traditional, Best Contemporary, Best Use of Color, and Most Innovative. An additional prize of \$50.00 will be awarded for Viewers' Choice, Judge's Choice, and Best of Show. Additional prizes by vendors or local businesses may also be awarded.
9. The North Star Quilters Guild reserves the right not to award ribbons if specific criteria are not met. The quilt show judge may decide whether there will be duplicate ribbons awarded in any category and may make special awards.
10. Items will be photographed by the North Star Quilters Guild for archival and publicity purposes.

Quilt Return

11. **Quilts must be picked up between 4:30 pm-5:30 pm on Sunday, October 20 at The Alerus Center.** You MUST have your quilt claim tickets.
(Your quilt will be shipped if you made those arrangements when entering your quilt.)

Quilt Entry Categories

A. One person quilt: Any quilt completely constructed and quilted by only one person.

B. Two person quilt: Any quilt that two people worked on, in any way. This includes quilting done for hire.

Small (Total perimeter up to 199")

Medium (Total perimeter 200-274")

Large (Total perimeter 275-349")

Extra Large (Total perimeter 350+")

All judged entries must be quilted. This means they must have at least three layers, held together by stitching. The only exception will be cathedral windows special technique and youth quilts which may be tied. Other items may be displayed in the non-judged category.

1. Hand Quilted

Entries can be any size. Quilting must be done by hand.

Hand Appliqué

Entries feature hand appliqué work.

2A. Any size, personally quilted

2B. Any size, quilted by someone else

Machine Appliqué

Entries feature machine applique work.

3A. Any size, personally quilted

3B. Any size, quilted by someone else

Pieced Quilts

Entries feature piecing.

4A. Small, personally quilted

5A. Larger sizes, personally quilted

6B. Small, quilted by someone else

7B. Medium, quilted by someone else

8B. Large, quilted by someone else

9B. Extra Large, quilted by someone else

10. Group Quilts

Made by 3 or more persons, any size, technique or quilting method.

11. Household Use/Garments

Includes quilted clothing and wearable accessories, table runners, kitchen or sewing room accessories, pillows, etc.

Junior Quilters

Quilts or quilted items made by a person 18 years of age or younger regardless of size or technique. Youth quilts may be tied.

12A. Personally quilted

12B. Quilted by someone else

Special Technique

Includes cross stitch, embroidery, whole cloth, crazy patch, cathedral window, trapunto, cheater cloth, faux chenille, photo transfer, non-traditional, and mixed techniques. Please specify special technique used on entry form.

13A. Personally quilted

13B. Quilted by someone else

14. Art Quilt

Entries in this category must be designed by the entrant. Traditional blocks used in innovative ways may fit into this category, but unusual coloration alone does not constitute an original design. No size or technique limitations apply, but all workmanship must be by the entering artist(s). Commercial pattern designs are not eligible for this category.

15. 2013 Paint Chip Challenge Quilt or Quilted Item

See Challenge rules on page 13.

16. Non-Judged

Entries are for display only and will not be judged.
