Quilt Entry Categories

1. Non-Judged

Entries in this category are for display only and will not be judged.

2. Barn Quilt Challenge - No fee

North Star Quilters Guild members are challenged to make one traditional quilt block with solid fabrics. Finished size is 24" to 30" square. This category is for display only and will not be judged.

3. Handwork

Entries can be any size. This category features hand applique, hand quilting and includes English paper piecing.

4. Wall Hangings

Entries in this category are quilted, can be of any size, including miniatures, and have the intended purpose of a wall hanging.

A. Personally quilted

5. Traditionally Pieced Quilts

Entries feature piecing and can be any size.

A. Personally quilted

B. Quilted by someone else

6. Paper and Foundation Pieced Quilts

Entries in this category must contain paper or foundation piecing as the main focus of the guilt.

A. Personally quilted

7. Modern Quilts

Modern quilts are primarily functional and inspired by modern design. Some or several of the following characteristics should be present to clearly identify the quilt as "modern": bold colors and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid color, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive negative space and alternate grid work.

8. Quilt Kits

This category includes kits of any size and group quilts. Also included are sew along quilts and BOM where material/fabric is provided with the pattern.

9. Special Techniques

Entries in this category include machine applique, cross stitch, embroidery, whole cloth, crazy patch, cathedral window, trapunto, cheater cloth, faux chenille, photo transfer, wool on wool, and non-traditional or mixed techniques.

Quilt Entry Categories

10. Home Décor and Wearables

Entries in this category include table toppers, runners, clothing and wearable accessories, kitchen or sewing room accessories, pillows, rugs, etc.

11. Holiday Themed

Entries in this category are quilted and intended for holiday use or display.

A. Personally quilted

B. Quilted by someone else

12. Art Quilt

Entries must be an original design by the entrant. Traditional blocks used in innovative ways may fit into this category but unusual coloration alone does not constitute an original design. No size or technique limitations apply, but all workmanship must be by the entering quilter/artist. Commercial pattern designs are not eligible for this category.

13. First-time entrant in a quilt show

Quilts or quilted items in this category are made by a quilter over 18 years of age.

14. Youth Quilters—No fee

Quilts or quilted items made by a person 18 years of age or younger regardless of size or technique. Youth quilts may be tied. There is no charge for youth quilt submissions and one free show entry will be provided for youth exhibitors.

Quilts on the Red 2023 Quilt Show Guidelines

Quilt Entry

Entries will be limited to 180 judged quilts plus up to 40 non-judged quilts. Individuals may have four entries per category. There is no limit to the number of categories. Categories may be subdivided by size once submitted for judging.

One entry form must be submitted for each item entered. Entry fee per item in category 3-13 is \$10.00 for NSQG members and \$15.00 for nonmembers. Nonjudged items in category 1 are \$5 and there is no charge for quilts entered in categories 2 and 14. Entry forms must be postmarked by October 2, 2023. Quilt Delivery

Quilts must be delivered to the Alerus Center, 1200 42nd Street South, Grand Forks, ND, on Tuesday, October 24, between 11:00 am-6:00 pm. YOU WILL BE GIVEN A CLAIM TICKET THAT MUST BE PRESENTED WHEN YOU PICK UP YOUR OUILT.

If you need to ship your quilt, it should be received by October 13 with return shipping in the amount of \$15 and your shipping label enclosed with your entry fee. Shipped quilts should be sent to:

Quilt Display and Judging

All judged entries must be quilted. This means they must have at least three layers, held together by stitching. The only exception will be items in the special technique category and youth quilts; refer to category descriptions for details. Other items may be displayed in the non-judged category.

The North Star Quilters Guild reserves the right to refuse quilts that are <u>not clean, smell of smoke</u>, <u>are covered with pet hair</u>, <u>or are otherwise not suitable for display</u>. If your quilt is not accepted due to these reasons, your entry fee will be refunded. Please look your quilt over carefully prior to quilt take in.

Entries exhibited for judging in previous North Star Quilters Guild quilt shows will not be accepted. The North Star Quilters Guild reserves the right to place quilts in a more appropriate category or to consolidate categories if there are insufficient entries in a single category. All judge's decisions are final.

Quilts must be picked up between 5:30 pm-6:30 pm on Saturday, October 28, at the Alerus Center. You MUST have your quilt claim tickets.

(Your guilt will be shipped if you indicated that on your guilt entry form.)

Awards

First, second, and third place ribbons will be awarded in each judged category. Purple ribbons and a \$100 cash prize are awarded as follows:

The following additional green ribbon awards will also be chosen by the judge:

Keep a photo and a description to substantiate any possible claim. During show hours guild members will patrol the display area, and security is provided by the Alerus Center. After hours, the Alerus Center and Quilt Show Exhibit Area are locked.

Quilt Appraisals

A written appraisal of quilts for insurance purposes will be available by appointment on Thursday afternoon and Friday at \$65 per quilt.

A verbal assessment of vintage and antique quilts, for information about the quilt but not for insurance purposes, will be available by appointment on Thursday afternoon and Friday at \$35 per quilt.

North Star Quilters Guild Member Challenges

Watercolor Challenge Round 4



North Star Quilters Guild (NSQG) and River Forks Watercolor Society (RFWS) will display the results of their fourth pairing. In 2017, these two local groups collaborated for the first time and have been creating art inspired by each other's work ever since. "I Get Around" is this year's theme. Art Quilters in the North Star Quilters Guild invited the watercolor artists to create a watercolor piece inspired by art quilts. 50 original pieces will be shown for the first time at this year's Quilts on the Red!

Barn Quilt Challenge

Barn quilts originated to encourage economic development by promoting ag-tourism and local businesses while bringing tourism to rural areas. While quilts are often made of a series of squares, a barn quilt is always a single square. These quilt blocks should be no smaller than 24" square and no larger than 30" square. They will contain only solid fabrics.

Raffle Quilt

Tickets for the 2023 North Star Quilters Guild raffle guilt can be purchased during the quilt show. The drawing for the quilt will be held on Saturday, October 28 at the Alerus. Proceeds will benefit the Community Violence Intervention Center (CVIC) and North Star Quilters Guild.

Hotel Room Block

Quilts on the Red has hotel room blocks for October 26, 27 and 28. Sleep Inn rates are \$99/night plus tax. Canad Inn rates are \$149/night plus tax. There are a limited number of rooms available and blocks will be released 30 days prior to the event.
